#### WHERE DO YOUR DONATIONS GO?

We plan to change our Membership Application for the next year to include a line for Museum Fund Donations. This will be in addition to the present line for Loyalty Fund Donations. Why would we do this? Well, there is a huge difference between the two funds. I'll explain.



The Loyalty Fund is the AXP® Operating Fund. Your dues go directly into the Loyalty Fund. We use this money to pay for Reunions, the Memorial Day Program, and the Christmas Dinner. Payment for the mailing of Newsletters, Directories, and other special mailings also comes out of the Loyalty Fund.

The Museum Fund supports our Museum. Operating our museum is the reason we are eligible to be a Non-Profit (501(c)) organization. Money in this fund can only be used for museum expenses like utilities, upkeep and renovations. For tax purposes, it is important that we keep these funds separated.

At the present time, our museum needs some major repairs and renovations. Supporting the Museum Fund is a more urgent use of money than added support for the Loyalty Fund. So, we are changing the Membership Application to allow for direct donations to the Museum Fund. We look forward to your continued support for the AXP®.
